Objective

This half day course explores the different perils faced by various subject matters of insurance that relate to deliberate acts by humans done with identifiable political, religious or ideological overtones. It will consider to what extent physical damage and liability insurers are prepared to offer these risks alongside more normal perils, or whether a separate market has developed to deal with them.

Examples and discussion will cover non marine, marine and aviation wordings. The session will also introduce the compulsory reinsurance options in various countries that are related to the writing of terrorism and related perils.
